Re: Shepherds Bush Town Centre West – Major Scheme

I write to tell you about upcoming highway improvement works being carried out in your area, in **Goldhawk Road** between Hammersmith Grove and Shepherds Bush Green.

These works are programmed to start on **Monday July 7, 2014**, and are expected to be completed by **March 2015**. The works will be carried out by Hammersmith & Fulham Council's contractor FM Conway, Monday to Saturday, 8am to 6pm.

These highway works form part of the wider Shepherds Bush town centre west regeneration scheme covering the area from the eastern ends of Goldhawk Road (to Devonport Rd), Uxbridge Road (to Coverdale Rd) and Lime Grove.

The work includes:

- Widening and repaving of the footway
- Carriageway resurfacing
- Street furniture de-cluttering
- Upgrading of existing street lights and signs
- Increased space for cyclists
- Pedestrian crossings and road junction improvements
- Installation of sustainable drainage systems (SuDS)

A detailed public consultation was carried out with residents about the scheme and residents were shown the major scheme proposals last September. The council has secured funding from Transport for London and private developers to carry out these works.

The works to **Goldhawk Road** will be carried out in four main phases:

- Southern footway (Richford Street to Shepherds Bush Green): July 2014 – Oct 2014
- Goldhawk Road junction with Hammersmith Grove: Sept 2014 – Dec 2014
- Northern footway (Titmuss Street to Shepherds Bush Green): Nov 2014 – March 2015
- Carriageway resurfacing along Goldhawk Road (Titmuss Street to Shepherds Bush Green): March 2015

The works have been phased to minimise disruption to local businesses and residents. Partial lane closures will be put in place with work taking place at two sections concurrently. Two-way traffic and a minimum 1.5 metre footway width will be maintained at all times along Goldhawk Road. We will let you know about any work that needs to be carried out at night or if any roads need to be closed.

All vehicles and pedestrians will still have access, as usual, and we will ensure that access to all properties and businesses will be maintained at all times.
